Minutes-Nov 19 General Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 by President Jim Totten WA8HUB who led participants in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Totten provided opening remarks thanking everybody for participating online.

New Business.

Agenda Item 1. Don Parker KB8PSL presented a dual-subject presentation

Parker shared a slide presentation on Amateur Radio "Go-Kits." He said that once a plan is activated there often is not much time to prepare. A mobile go-kit might contain headphones, 25' of coax (RG-58) or 100' of RG-8X, connectors and assorted adaptors, paper copies of common frequencies, and perhaps a chair and folding table.

Parker showed a photo of a crowded EOC room with police, fire, and other participants and explained that headphones are a necessity to hear in crowed rooms.

He said typical activations include storms, flooding, blizzards, and power outages caused by wind.

Other kit items might include spare batteries, an HT battery charger, antenna connectors, magnetic-mount antenna, a J-pole or quad antenna, and a power strip. Other items might be a AA battery pack, extra AA batteries, water or non-alcoholic beverages, snacks, two or three pens, flashlight, and a small knife. Parker went on to describe assorted tools, duct tape, jacket or sweat shirt, rain gear, boots, and a small fanny pack. Also included might be a basic first aid kit, vinyl gloves, alcohol wipes, face mask, hand sanitizers, band aids, aspirin, Tylenol, and/or Pepto Bismal.

For Part Two of his presentation, Don Parker spoke to members about power lines. His visual presentation was of a power pole with a distribution power line near the top, then transformers, next secondary power lines, and lastly telephone/cable TV lines.

He described the danger of downed power lines and advised members to stay 40 to 50 feet away from high voltage lines, and 15 feet away from distribution lines.

Agenda Item 2. Reports

Jim Totten WA8HUB asked for a motion to accept October's Minutes as published in the newsletter. Steve Siwecki KD8NUC moved we accept; Larry Darner KD8RER seconded. Members had no additions. Motion passed.

Treasurer John Westerkamp W8LRJ provided a Financial Summary. We had \$237 income in dues and spent about \$3,000 on computer equipment for the clubhouse and Comm Center Stations. Details will show up in November's report to members. Joe Muchnij N8QOD moved we accept the Treasurer's Summary; Larry Darner seconded. Motion passed.

Agenda Item 3. Open Discussion

Sean Dickens K8SPD reported that the new computers were purchased and installed. He then met with one of the pastors of the church in the building and was able to connect to the church's Internet service. It is high speed and works great. The church is sharing its internet with BARC at no cost as a "friendly neighbor". A suggestion by a BARC Planning Group member to make an annual donation of \$100 to the church to express our appreciation for the shared internet service was approved by the Planning Group at one of its past meetings.

Dickens said that as a non-profit organization BARC can apply for no-cost Microsoft Office 365 software. He said the club needs to get with Tech Soup, and they can validate us as a non-profit in order to request the no-cost software. Dickens asked about who controls our domain name and Jim Totten advised Dickens to contact Russ Roysden N8NPT.

John Westerkamp gave an update on Echolink. He is going to replace it with All-Star Echolink after a part he ordered arrives. He also stated he was able to connect Wires-X on the BARC 440 repeater. James Dean W8UD reported he was able to connect using his Wires-X radio.

Don Parker reported that he and Jim Gifford KD8APT were able to install the BARC signs at the four entrances to Bellbrook—at the City Limits on West Franklin Street and East Franklin Street (SR-725), on North Main Street/Upper Bellbrook Road and on South Main Street/Waynesville Road.

Ken Gunton W8ASA asked if our Magic Jack phone still works. Paul Sharp KD8OPN said we had paid

ahead four or five years, three years ago. Sean Dickens said he checked it and it still works well.

Paul Sharp advised he had placed several pieces of Ham gear donated to the club on the second to back table. Members can take what they need and the club will accept donations.

Steve Siwecki was checking with Fred Stone W8LLY (who had not yet joined the meeting.) Fred Stone and Henry Ruminski W8HUR are on the Nominating Committee and need to report on the slate of officers for 2021. Fred Stone then joined the Zoom meeting after being detained by another obligation. He said all officers are eligible to serve for another year and have agreed to do so.

Only the Junior Director position is vacant, because under the bylaws the Junior Director (Joe Muchnij) advances to the Senior Director position (occupied by Roger Parrett NQ8RP during 2020). Stone announced that Jackie Wysong KE8LZE had volunteered for Junior Director and was proposed as a nominee for the position. No other nominations were proposed from the floor. Ken Gunton moved we accept the slate of nominations; Darryl Fowler KD8JQE seconded. Passed. The Election of 2021 Officers and Jr. Director will be held at the December general membership meeting in accordance with the BARC Constitution & By-Laws. The Slate of Candidates includes incumbents Jim Totten-President, Don Parker-Vice President, Jim Gifford-Secretary, John Westerkamp-Treasurer and Jacalyn Wysong-Junior Director.

Jim Totten discussed the possibility of using browsers to do one-on-one meetings. Fred Stone said we had previously decided not to use it for meetings. Totten said he wasn't talking about for Club meetings but about two people just meeting and seeing one another.

Adjournment

Ray Hitt moved we adjourn; John Westerkamp seconded. Passed.

The meeting ended at about 8:38 pm.

The ZOOM meeting was called to order at 7:30 by the President, and he uploaded the agenda for all to view.

Totten talked about <u>Agenda Item 3</u> first, which is "My current feeling is that we will be doing Zoom meetings at least through February (maybe longer)" No attendee disagreed or added to this discussion.

Agenda Item 1. Report and Discussion on the changes made by John Westerkamp W8LRJ and his team.

Sean Dickens K8SPD provided an update on the new computers (John Westerkamp was ill and could not participate). Dickens said the wireless access point is up and running. The PCs are ready. Computer names will probably be called Com Center 1, 2, etc.

Jim Totten asked if there was an update on Microsoft 365. Dickens said it is still a goal. He knows who he needs to contact in the club. Dickens said he will follow up on it.

A side conversation developed about the number of people in the building and wearing of masks.

In the absence of John Westerkamp, Assistant Treasurer, Paul Sharp KD8OPN provided an interim

Financial Summary. \$250.94 was collected in dues and free money received as part of the Amazon Rewards program and \$2,663.38 in expenditures on the new computers.

Just before the meeting, John Westerkamp sent out the following **EMAIL** on the BARC Reflector:

"For November 2020, we had income of \$250.94 consisting mostly of dues and income from Amazon Rewards for \$35.94. Expenses were \$2663.38 for the new computers and monitors and some networking equipment.

Finally, as voted on at the July Planning meeting and now that we have Internet access through the church, I plan on sending a \$100 donation from BARC to the church next week in a Christmas/New Year's card.

Question: I received two postcards from OARC (Ohio Area Repeater Council) reminding us that every two years the repeater trustee must file a Statement of Record that the repeater is still in use. One was to Dave Walton which is for W8DGN. The other was to Henry Bussey which is for W8GCA and W8TOG (Henry has a repeater, I guess). I can take care of these or forward the postcards to Dave and Henry. Let me know what you want me to do, but we probably need to respond soon.

Summary of Various Upgrades

- 1. The Wires-X system has been put in place and is being used regularly as people test out the capability. Most people with Yaesu radios should be able to activate the Wires-X system and connect to "rooms" all around the world and communicate with other hams. This is a digital voice system so the audio clarity is excellent.
- 2. The Allstar Link/EchoLink node has finally been completed and is up and running. I will be sending out some information on how to use it hopefully next week. Much like IRLP (which no longer is available), Allstar allows users to connect to other Allstar nodes and repeaters around the world using DTMF codes. Allstar is an analog system so the audio quality is as good as your audio reaching the local repeater.
- Clubhouse computer and networking upgrades are in progress. Sean and I were going to install everything today, but I am under the weather so we will do it next week. We will install ham applications on the

computers, bring all the QSO/contact information up-to-date on LotW and Clublog, and install a network access point and switch to link everything together. Sean can provide additional details.

- 2. I spoke with Wynn Rollert, W6CDR, this afternoon and although Henry Bussey is still listed as the Licensee on the W8TOG repeater (it is Henry's callsign, too), Wynn purchased all the repeater hardware from Henry and is in possession of it. I can definitely work on that one with Wynn.
- 3. The OARC site also asks for a \$5 dues payment when submitting the Statement of Record. IF that could be ok'd, too, that would be great.

Don Parker KB8PSL stated that he lost a good friend this week, a lieutenant on Centerville's Fire Department, to COVID-19. Parker stressed the importance of wearing masks.

Paul Sharp encouraged members to participate in each Sunday night's BARC Net. Sharp said many have joined this net, and a couple times it went over 50 minutes.

Jim Totten asked in the Worldwide Friendship Net was still on 147.045? One person said he thought it was now on the Kettering repeater, 147.075.

Ray Hitt N8VMX mentioned Trevor Clarke's email on using the solar eclipse for propagation. Hitt suggested we read it and give it a try.

Adjournment

Meeting ended at around 8:11pm.
